There is an introduction to feedback and questioning skills in supervision. Thereafter, the participants try the tools and strategies in practice.

Educational developers should focus on how they teach the subject, whereas PhD supervisors should focus on how to practice the tools.

Each participant prepares ½ page; educational developers address how they teach feedback and communication skills to PhD supervisors, and PhD supervisors should write about how they give feedback to their PhD students.
